Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) SOPS® Database De-Identified Research Dataset Contents

This document is for researchers interested in requesting de-identified SOPS data from the AHRQ Surveys on Patient Safety Culture® (SOPS®) Database and shows the contents of the de-identified research datasets.

The SOPS Database is a central repository for SOPS survey data. The SOPS Database is funded by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ), and managed and administered by its contractor, Westat.

The SOPS Database is populated with SOPS data through the voluntary participation of organizations that have administered a SOPS survey and optionally SOPS supplemental items set(s) and submit their SOPS data for inclusion in the Database. Research datasets contain de-identified Database data for hospitals, medical offices, ambulatory surgery centers, nursing homes, and community pharmacies.

Table 1 shows the contents of each SOPS de-identified core research dataset, including information on the survey items, site characteristics, and ID variables included in each dataset. Dataset names for each setting contain hyperlinks to the relevant SOPS survey web pages.

Table 2 shows the contents of each SOPS de-identified supplemental item set dataset available for research purposes, including information on the survey items and ID variables included in each supplemental item set dataset. Dataset names contain hyperlinks to the relevant SOPS supplemental item set web pages.
