Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) SOPS® Database De-Identified Research Dataset Contents

This document is for individuals interested in requesting de-identified SOPS data from the AHRQ SOPS Database and shows the contents of the de-identified research datasets.

The Surveys on Patient Safety Culture™ (SOPS®) Database is a central repository for SOPS survey data. The SOPS Database is funded by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) and managed and administered by its contractor, Westat.

The SOPS Database is populated with SOPS data through the voluntary participation of organizations that have administered a SOPS survey and are willing to submit their SOPS data for inclusion in the Database. Research datasets contain de-identified Database data for hospitals, medical offices, nursing homes, ambulatory surgery centers, and community pharmacies.

Table 1 shows the content of each SOPS de-identified research dataset, including information on the survey items, site characteristics, and ID variables included in each dataset. Dataset names for each setting contain hyperlinks to survey websites.
