The document provides a comprehensive introduction to readiness assessments and their purpose in health and health care organizations.</p>	<p>Users are walked through an in-depth series of questions relevant in content and scope to an organization’s decision to create a quality strategy aligned to the National Quality Strategy (NQS). This HRSA assessment will require a higher level of effort to complete than others listed in this document.</p>

IHI created the Triple Aim to accelerate health care quality improvement, which is a framework for optimizing health system performance by simultaneously focusing on the health of a population, the experience of care for individuals within that population, and the per capita cost of providing that care.</p>	<p>The NQS’ three overarching aims build on the IHI Triple Aim. This IHI tool process is a nine-question quiz that users take from the point of view of their organization. It asks questions about the organization’s involvement in the population health field and major Federal programs like Medicare ACOs involved in managing population health, as well as whether the organization uses quantitative measurement to determine the efficacy of its programs.</p>

This resource includes questions and content that assess key elements of an organization’s readiness to institute a quality management and improvement plan.</p>	<p>This Plan is 26 slides. Though some of the content in this module is tailored to disease-specific work, organizations looking to create a quality plan can answer the questions included on these slides to begin thinking about their organization’s broader quality improvement goals and how they align with the NQS aims, priorities, and levers.</p>
